IS THIS YOUR LAST NEWSLETTER (PART 1)

Each year the 4-H Office is required by federal law to update enrollments and mailing list. In Pima County 4-H this task is accomplished by January 1. So, if you have not re-enrolled for the 2008-2009 4-H Year, on January 1 you will no longer be enrolled or part of the Pima County 4-H Program. Since the newsletter mailing list is created from the enrollment data, if you're not enrolled, a newsletter label won't be produced, and you won't receive a newsletter. So, make sure that you are enrolled for the 2008-2009 4-H Year. If not, this will be your last 4-H newsletter.

IS THIS YOUR LAST NEWSLETTER (PART 2)

At least in hard copy form. In an effort to decrease postage expenses, printing expenses, and get the newsletter to you quicker, the newsletter is going on-line starting with the February issue. How does this work? On your enrollment form, if you checked off on the box indicating that you desire to receive the newsletter via e-mail, you will receive an e-mail message indicating that the newsletter is available and the link to get it. If you did not check off on the box, the newsletter will be sent to you via USPS, the same as in the past.

A couple of things to keep in mind if multiple people use one e-mail address, you may get multiple e-mails announcing the availability of the newsletter. Also, if there are multiple people enrolled from your family, the hard copy will still be mailed if one person did not check off to receive the newsletter via e-mail. For example, if four people are enrolled in 4-H in your family, and three checked off to receive the newsletter via e-mail and one did not, you will still get a hard copy.

This is a transition time where the newsletter will still be available and sent as a hard copy. Not too far in the distant future, the newsletter will be available in electronic version only. Once that transition is made and we go to electronic version only, we will be able to include more forms, photos and information as we won't be constrained by a printing budget and the capabilities of printing equipment.

4-H and FFA members must have AZ Youth Livestock Quality Assurance certification training when they tag or submit ownership papers for their livestock. The certification must be valid through the end of the Pima County Fair or approximately May 1, 2009. 4-H/FFA members who will be exhibiting in the following projects are required to have this training: beef, sheep, swine, meat goats, dairy goats or dairy cattle, rabbit meat pen or individual fryer, poultry fryer or roaster pens and squab pens. You must be present for the entire workshop to receive credit. No programs in Pima County will be offered after January 11th. Remember, you will not be allowed to tag an animal if you have not met the Quality Assurance requirement. Please register for these sessions by calling Jennifer at 626-5161. The fee is \$10.00 per person. Each participant will receive a handbook, hands-on learning and snacks.

W-9'S REQUIRED FOR 2009 PCJLSI AUCTION

In order for 4-H and FFA members to receive their auction checks they are required by the Internal Revenue Service to provide a W-9 with Social Security Number to the Pima County Junior Livestock Sales, Inc. A link to this form can be found at: IRS.gov, search for W-9 forms. These will be collected at Fair weigh-in. No checks will be issued without a valid and completed W-9.

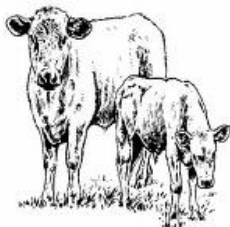

WHERE ARE YOUR KIDS?

On September 23, 2008, the City of Tucson Mayor and Council adopted Tucson City Code Ordinance 11-65 “Unattended Child in Motor Vehicle”. This ordinance, which becomes effective on Saturday, November 15, 2008, prohibits the act of leaving a child under the age of ten inside a motor vehicle without supervision of another person who is at least fourteen years of age.

The City of Tucson along with the Tucson Police Department, wish to remind the public of the importance of always being aware of where our youngest citizens are at all times. Officers will be passing out an informational pamphlet to drivers with young children, reminding them of the danger of leaving children unattended inside vehicles. The safety tips listed below could help save a life.

- **Know where your children are at all times.**
- **Place an item of importance such as a purse, gym bag, merchandise, in the back seat near your child.**
- **Always open the rear door when you arrive at your destination in order to ensure that nobody has been left behind.**
- **Never leave children alone inside a vehicle while you enter a business, even for a short period of time or if they are within sight.**

Starburst Game

Supplies needed: 2-4 starbursts (M and M's or Skittles would work, I like Starburst because they are wrapped individually) per person

Have your group sit in a circle and instruct them to take a determined number of starbursts (based on how many candies you have and how many kids there are) but not to eat them...yet. Once the candy has been passed out tell them for each color they chose they have to share some information. An example might be:
