4-H SCHOLARSHIP GOLF TOURNAMENT POSTPONED – HELP NEEDED

The recent economic crisis is affecting the Pima County 4-H program. Last year the tournament had four major sponsors, 20 hole or tee sponsors and 68 golfers. This year we have one major sponsor and only two hole/tee sponsors lined up. The sponsors are a very important part of a successful fund raising event. The decision to postpone the tournament was made by both the Golf Committee which works to find donors and golfers for the event and the Pima County 4-H Executive Council.

The 4-H Executive Council uses the funds from this tournament to help our 4-H members attend college, JOLT (Journey of Opportunities for Tomorrow's Leaders), CWF (Citizenship Washington Focus), National 4-H Congress, National 4-H Conference, and various camps and other leadership development opportunities. The 4-H Executive Council also provides funds for the Round Robin Belt buckles, mini grants for clubs or projects, and supports the 4-H newsletter.

How will this affect 4-H in 2009 – 2010? The Executive Council will have a smaller budget for these items ... and fewer members will be helped to attend these events. Those who do attend will need to have more support from their family. The program may be affected in other ways that are not identifiable at this time.

The Golf Committee will be meeting within the next month to set a new date for the event. There are opportunities for members, parents and volunteers to help with it. 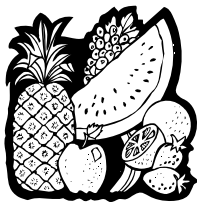
FRUIT WORD SEARCH

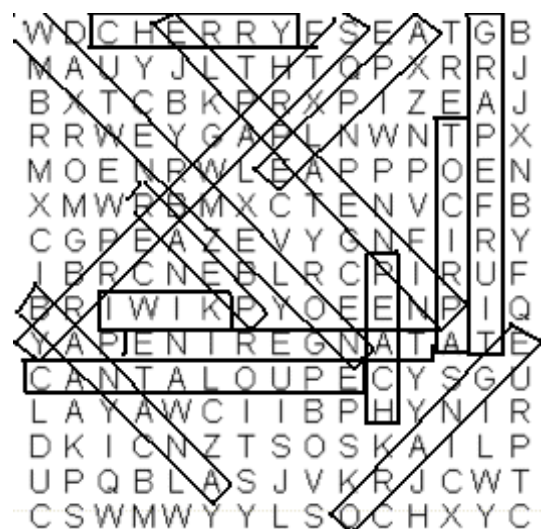
