OBJECTIVES OF PROGRAM

The Junior Livestock Program provides many worthwhile experiences and opportunities for Pinal County's 4-H, FFA and Association members. Specific objectives of the program are:

1. To teach responsibilities to 4-H, FFA and Association members in the caring of market animals.
2. To teach skills and good habits regarding proper feeding, health care, fitting and showing of market animals.
3. To provide 4-H, FFA and Association members a program that will be both educational and enjoyable.
4. To offer a learning program with emphasis on success, but not dominated by competition.
5. To promote an attitude of sharing knowledge among members with other members, older and younger, and with the entire family.
6. To teach and encourage safe handling practices at all times, when working with or showing the market animal.

CODE OF ETHICS

Exhibitors shall conduct themselves in such a manner as to be a credit to themselves, to their club/chapter and to their leader/advisor. All policies and procedures relating to conduct, as determined by the Pinal County Jr. Livestock Program Code of Conduct, will be enforced. Competitive events are held primarily for their educational value. Member's participation in all Fair contests should display good sportsmanship throughout the Fair. Failure of an exhibitor to so conduct him or herself or failure to abide by or follow any applicable rule, policy or procedure shall be grounds for disqualification. Disqualification means that the exhibitor's animal may not be shown or sold at the auction. The Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee will make the decision after listening to all persons with direct knowledge of the alleged misconduct, including the exhibitor. All decisions of the Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee are final.

☆☆ All rules and requirements will be strictly ENFORCED and will be up held by the Pinal County Jr. Livestock Committee. There will be no exceptions!

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

- A. Each exhibitor must have their Arizona Quality Assurance Certification prior to exhibiting at the Pinal County Fair. To obtain Arizona Quality Assurance Certification exhibitors must complete a half day training workshop. Certification will be valid for 3 years. At receiving of fair, exhibitors must show verification of their Arizona Quality Assurance Certification.
- B. Each exhibitor must read, sign, and obey the Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee Code of Conduct Form. In addition, exhibitors are required to have their parent and 4-H leader, FFA Advisor or Association leader sign the form. The Code of Conduct Form must be completed and turned in at the time of receiving/weigh-in of fair. (Note: Code of Conduct Form is included in the back of this rule book.)
- C. Each exhibitor will be allowed to tag up to three (3) animals with no more than two (2) being of the same species. Official designation of each animal as a market or carcass must be made with the exhibitor's club leader or chapter advisor by March 2, 2009, prior to the carcass receiving date.
 1. Each exhibitor may show two (2) animals of different species in the market division. However, only one animal may be sold at the Jr. Livestock Auction. The animal eligible for sale must be declared at weigh-in.
 2. Each exhibitor may show only one (1) animal in the carcass division. Only the Grand and Reserve Champion carcass animals will be sold at the auction.
- D. Official entry forms for all carcass and market divisions are available in the back of this rule book and will be distributed the day of ear tagging. Entry forms must be fully completed and turned-in at the time the animal is tagged. For entry into the feeder and breeding shows exhibitors must complete the official Junior Livestock Feeder and Breeding Show entry form, included in the requirement book. Feeder and breeding show entry forms must be postmarked to the address listed on the form by March 2, 2009. (Note: The Official Market/Carcass Entry Form and Feeder/Breeding Entry Form is included in the back of this rule book.)
- E. Pinal County Jr. Livestock Exhibitors, upon submitting an entry of 4-H/Association/FFA Project Livestock, are certifying their animal being presented for exhibition at the Pinal County Fair to be free from disease. Livestock Exhibitors shall be subject to the recommendation of the AZ Veterinarian Office as to the health requirements for the livestock as follows:
 1. Any testing procedure as directed by the State Veterinarian's Office will be enforced as directed by the PCJLC.
 2. Brucellosis: No requirement (Arizona is a certified area).
 3. Tuberculosis: No requirement.
 4. Quarantined Herds: No animals from herds under quarantine will be allowed entry.
 5. All animals showing signs of sickness or disease will be ordered from the fairgrounds after verification from the fair veterinarian.
 6. The Livestock Superintendents have the right and responsibility to reject any livestock exhibit showing evidence of disease, infection, or safety hazards to other animals, spectators or exhibitors.

- F. Certificates of Inspection of Exhibition Swine and Seasonal Self-Inspection Certificates must be submitted to the specie superintendent before entering the scales. The Certificate of Inspection for Exhibition Swine and the Seasonal Pass Certificate are a requirement of the Arizona Department of Agriculture, Animal Services Division and all exhibitors must be in compliance in order to participate at the Pinal County Fair.
1. All swine must be accompanied by a "Certificate of Inspection of Exhibition Swine" issued by an Arizona Department of Agriculture livestock inspector. Contact the Arizona Department of Agriculture at 1-800-294-0305 or (602)542-0872 to arrange for the inspection.
 2. Beef, goat, lamb and veal animals must be accompanied by an Arizona Department of Agriculture "Seasonal Self-Inspection Certificate." A Seasonal Self-Inspection certificate may be obtained by calling (602)542-6407.
- G. Current and completed financial records must be presented at the time of weigh-in for all market and carcass livestock divisions. Entries received without financial records or inspection records will not be processed. These will be returned to the member by the Livestock Superintendent.
- H. Market animals that do not make the proper weight at the fair weigh-in may be exhibited in showmanship, and those animals declared non-selling must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday, at 5:00 p.m.
- I. Market animals must be owned by 4-H, FFA and Association exhibitors to be used in showmanship. Breeding or feeder animals will be allowed to be shown in showmanship if the exhibitor's market animal is not available.
- J. Only immediate family members, current Pinal County Jr. Livestock Exhibitors, or approved PCJLC Leaders are allowed to ASSIST the exhibitor in fitting, showing, and overall care of their project animal(s). The exhibitor must be present and physically engaged at ALL times while assistance is being offered. (Physical presence is NOT considered active participation or physically engaged.)
1. Leaders, assistant leaders, or anyone else interested in helping the youth livestock exhibitors must become certified as an approved PCJLC Leader. An approved PCJLC Leader is defined as any adult, 18 years of age or older, who has completed a Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee Leader Registration Form. This form must be completed and submitted to the Junior Livestock Committee no later than the time of specie ear tagging. All adult leaders, even if they are certified 4-H, Association, or FFA Leaders, must register with the PCJLC in order to become approved.
 2. Upon first violation of this rule, the exhibitor will have a \$100 fine deducted from their auction sales check or, if the animal has been declared a no sale, a \$100 fine will be required by immediate payment. Second violation, the exhibitor will be removed from the auction.
- K. All livestock exhibitors are required to be properly groomed and dressed appropriately at the fair, show and auction. All exhibitors must have their shirts tucked in and belted. Required attire from 4-H members includes a white collared shirt, 4-H tie or scarf, blue jeans and appropriate shoes. FFA members must wear the official FFA dress. Required attire for Association members include a white collared shirt, clean dark jeans and a solid red colored tie or scarf. The dress code will be enforced. **Exhibitors not following the dress code will not be allowed entrance into the show and/or sale ring.**
- L. Members that do not properly feed and care for their animals will be required to remove their animals from the fairgrounds.
- M. All market animals must be officially weighed on the designated scales at the fairgrounds. Exhibitors must remain with their exhibits until the Livestock Superintendents accept the entries and they are assigned and placed in a stall.
- N. Each exhibitor must furnish their own feed and feeding/watering equipment. Washed sand bedding will be available at the fairgrounds.
- O. Each exhibitor is responsible for keeping the grounds clean around their exhibit. Before livestock are removed from the fairgrounds, the exhibit area must be cleaned.
- P. An exhibitor number will be assigned to each livestock exhibitor for each animal exhibited and will be indicated on the weigh-in tag. Each exhibitor must wear and predominately display their exhibitor entry number on their back.
- Q. Livestock will be released on Sunday of the fair. Each exhibitor is responsible for the feeding and care of his/her animal up to that time and responsible for cleaning his/her club exhibit area.

Sunday Release of Animals Regulations:

1. ALL ANIMALS MUST BE FED AND WATERED by 8:00 am.
 2. ALL SWINE EXHIBITORS pens must be cleaned and all tack removed from the barn by 8:00 AM.
 3. Each exhibitor must check-out with their club leader/chapter advisor. Each leader must sign-off that each of their exhibitors have fed and watered their animal as well as cleaned their animal's pen on Sunday.
 4. A \$50 fine will deducted from the exhibitor's check upon violation of these regulations outlined in items 1-3.
 5. At 9:00 am the Swine Barn will be closed to all exhibitors.
 6. Photos will be released on Sunday at 11:00 am next to the PCJLC Office.
- R. Livestock fees, which include the fair entrance pass, photography fee and stall fee, will be deducted from exhibitor auction check. Animals that don't make weight, but are going to participate in Showmanship only, will need to pay these fees at

weigh-in. **No Exceptions!**

- S. Exhibitors will only be allowed to exhibit and/or auction animals in one county fair within Arizona. Any exhibitor, who is found in violation of showing and/or selling an animal in more than one Arizona county fair, will be barred along with their siblings, from any future participation at the Pinal County Fair.
- T. A 3% shrink will only be applied to animals weighing below the minimum weight requirement for beef, goat, lamb and swine entries.
- U. For breeding heifer, doe, lamb and gilt classes, 24 months of age and younger, will be allowed to be exhibited. Breeding classes will be divided based upon entries and at the discretion of the Superintendents. For the Goat breeding show only meat type goat breeds will be acceptable for entry. For entry into the breeding show, exhibitors must complete and submit the included Feeder and Breeding Entry Form by the due date.
- V. All exhibitors must comply with the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, and the Wholesome Assurance Statement as published below. Health Regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture require that animals treated with drugs, pesticides or any other chemical must go through the prescribed withdrawal period as listed on the label. Therefore, it is important that exhibitors determine the type of treatments used if the animals must be dipped or treated prior to leaving the point of origin.

USDA WHOLESOME MEAT ACT

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the Pinal County Fair as follows:

- a. Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
- b. Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required withdrawal periods.
- c. Before administering antibiotics and/or sulfonamides, consult a licensed practicing veterinarian, or label directions of the drug.
- d. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
- e. If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned. If drug or other chemical residues are found in the urine, blood or tissue from an animal sold through a sale connected with the Pinal County Fair, the PCJLC or the Fair will in no way be liable or responsible for the condition of the carcass or sale price of animal. Exhibitor will forfeit all rights to the sale proceeds.

WHOLESOME ASSURANCE STATEMENT

The use of animal drugs or other substances by non-veterinarians in any manner other than in accordance with the labeling approved by FDA, is a violation of federal law.* Food animals must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA established tolerances for any foreign substance including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals. Violation results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA for prosecution.

Any misrepresentation of a food animal that can potentially affect the acceptability of the carcass or milk will be considered fraud.

* Note: Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation. (PLEASE CONSULT YOUR PROJECT LEADER IF YOU DO NOT UNDERSTAND ANY OF THESE STATEMENTS.)

- W. The PCJLC reserves the right to conduct drug tests on any animal exhibited. In the event of a positive result, the exhibitor will be removed from the auction and banned for life from showing animals at the Pinal County Fair.
- X. **PROTEST POLICY:** All protests must be submitted in writing along with a \$50 deposit. A written protest must be delivered to the Jr. Livestock Office within twelve (12) hours of a protested occurrence. A \$50 cash and/or certified funds deposit must accompany the protest. The deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests will be adjudicated by the PCJLC, whose decision is final.

ASSOCIATION DIVISION GUIDELINES

- 1. Age Limit 9 through 19, with January 1 of the current fair year as the deadline.
- 2. Must maintain an active junior membership within a Livestock Breed Association relative to the specie(s) to be exhibited. Proof of Breed Association Junior Membership must be submitted at the specie ear tagging. (A list of Breed Associations is included on page 14.)
- 3. Must participate under the guidance of a designated Leader recognized by the PCJLC. This leader can be the participant's parent or a group leader. For Association Leaders to be recognized by the PCJLC, they must complete and submit an informational form, at or before the date of the specie ear tagging, to the PCJLC for review and subsequent approval.

4. The Participant's legal residence must be within the geographical boundaries of Pinal County. The only exception to this rule would apply to any child, regardless of their residence, who participated in the 2003, 2004 or 2005 Pinal County Jr. Livestock Show as a member of a Pinal County 4-H Club or FFA Chapter, will, along with their immediate siblings, be allowed to continue their participation in the Pinal County Jr. Livestock show as long as they participate under the rules and regulations of the Association Division.
5. The PCJLC will have a hierarchy of leadership to help administer and oversee the association division.

LIVESTOCK AWARDS AND RECOGNITION

The purpose of the awards program is to recognize the efforts and accomplishments of Pinal County 4-H, FFA and Association members enrolled in the Junior Livestock program. A special awards session will be held during the Pinal County Fair to provide such recognition. All livestock exhibitors need to attend this session, which will be printed in the 2009 Pinal County Fair Schedule of Events. Specific information on awards is as follows:

1. A modified Danish system of judging shall be used in all classes. The market judges may select purple, blue, red, or white ribbon animals for all classes and specify their ranking for each ribbon group. The top two animals from each judging class or division shall be eligible for consideration in the selection of Grand and Reserve Champion classes.
2. Each club will be judged for herdsmanship awards daily. Criteria for evaluations will be condition of stall and surrounding areas, care and provisions for animals, and over-all sportsmanship and pride in their club's entries. In each Market division (Beef, Goat, Lamb, Swine and Veal), First, Second and Third place prizes will be awarded to the winning groups during the Junior Livestock Awards session.
3. All exhibitors are **REQUIRED** to enter their market animal in the Junior Livestock Showmanship contest. The four divisions of showmanship competition are:
 1. **Senior Showman** - (over 14 yrs. of age or older and completed more than one year in the livestock division).
 2. **Junior Showman** - (less than 14 yrs. of age and completed more than one year in the livestock division).
 3. **Senior Novice** - (over 14 yrs. of age or older and first year in the livestock division).
 4. **Junior Novice** - (less than 14 yrs. of age and first year in the livestock division).
4. Grand Champion exhibitors of the Junior, Junior Novice, Senior, and Senior Novice Showmanship contests for beef, goat, lamb, swine and veal will be eligible to participate in the Round Robin Showmanship contest.
5. All livestock exhibitors are encouraged to participate in the Livestock Judging contest and the Beef, Goat, Lamb and Swine Skill-A-Thon contests to be held during the week of Fair. Special recognition will be provided to the winning teams and individuals from all contests. Only Pinal County 4-H, FFA and Association members will be allowed to participate in these contests.
6. Best Arizona Bred Class. This is for all species. Animals must be bred and bought in Arizona. A receipt of verification will be needed. To enter this class, you must submit a copy of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of your animal on the day of ear tagging.

JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION AND SALE RULES

- A. 4-H, FFA and Association members owning animals must personally show and sell their animal at the Auction. All livestock exhibitors are required to be ready with their animal one hour before the Auction and be familiar with the sale order.
- B. The Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee shall be in charge of the sale.
- C. Each 4-H, FFA and Association member are asked to contact a minimum of three livestock buyers for the sale of their animal. Local support of our Auction from throughout Pinal County will help everyone.
- D. Jr. Livestock Auction Sale Eligibility:
 1. Participant must be in good standing and enrolled in the Pinal County 4-H Program, a Pinal County FFA Chapter or a Pinal County Association Member.
 2. Each market livestock exhibitor will be allowed to sell one market animal through the Auction. The only two situations which would allow an exhibitor to sell more than one animal in the auction is for such a member to receive grand or reserve champion in the carcass division and/or to receive grand or reserve champion in the market division with their second animal. Only Grand and Reserve Champion animals will be sold at the Auction from the carcass program.

3. All market beef, goats, lambs, swine and veal must receive a purple, blue, red, or white award at the fair in order to be sold in the Auction.
- E. Grand and Reserve Champion, purple, blue and red ribbon animals will be sold individually. The **MINIMUM** price bid on purple, blue or red animals, by specie, will determine the **MAXIMUM** price to be paid for white ribbon animals in that specie. The price received for the Grand Champion market animal of each specie will set the maximum sale price for Reserve Champion. The price received for Reserve Champion will establish the maximum sale price for each specie during the remainder of the Auction.
 - F. All Add-on Bids will go directly to the intended exhibitor without limit.
 - G. ALL SALES ARE FINAL! Any exhibitor or anyone acting for the exhibitor, who is found guilty of asking a purchaser to either give him/her animal back or sell it to him/her for packer's price or to trade the animal sold for another animal, will be barred from further participation in the Pinal County Fair.
 - H. Between ear tagging and the start of the Pinal County Fair, the Junior Livestock Committee will select a system of rotating species to establish an official sale order.
 - I. All Grand and Reserve Champion animals must be slaughtered by one of the approved Auction packing houses, selected by the buyer.
 - J. For exhibitors showing two market animals.
 1. Exhibitor must declare at receiving/weigh-in which animal will be sold in the Junior Livestock Auction.
 2. If the non-declared animal wins grand or reserve champion, it will be sold in place of the declared animal.
 3. If an exhibitor is awarded grand and/or reserve champion with both market animals, both animals will sell in the Auction.
 4. All non-declared market animals not selling in the auction must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday at 5:00 p.m.
 - K. NO BARN SALES or solicitation of buyers will be allowed.
 - L. Each exhibitor must show and sell his or her own animal.
 - M. Exhibitors whose parent(s) participate in the auction as a buyer will NOT receive their auction sales check until his or her parent(s)'s auction account(s) has been paid in full.
 - N. Each exhibitor exceeding \$600 in add-ons will be required to complete, sign and turn-in a W-9 Form in order to receive his or her auction proceeds check. Exhibitors exceeding \$600 in add-ons will be notified after the fair and will be provided the proper W-9 Form. In January, 2010, a 1099 Form will be issued from the PCJLC to the exhibitor for their total in add-on premiums. This form and procedure is required by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) in order for the PCJLC to issue auction proceeds checks to those exhibitors exceeding \$600 in add-ons.

MARKET BEEF REQUIREMENTS

ALL 4-H, FFA AND ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MUST BE PROPERLY ENROLLED FOR THE 2008-2009 CLUB YEAR UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF ANY ENROLLED 4-H MARKET BEEF PROJECT LEADER, AG-ED INSTRUCTOR AND/OR AN ASSOCIATION LEADER. THESE RECOGNIZED CLUBS AND MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO UPHOLD THE FOLLOWING BEEF PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.

A. MARKET BEEF PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. All animals must be beef-type steers.
2. Market Beef projects must be owned by the 4-H, FFA or Association member no later than Saturday, October 11, 2008 which is also the final date for ear tagging.

B. MARKET BEEF EAR TAGGING/PICTURE REQUIREMENTS

1. Ear tagging and photographs showing the ear tag, animal and exhibitor will be done at a central location. The PCJLC strongly recommends that all steers are manageable.
2. Ear tagging and photographs will be done **Saturday, October 4, 2008, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. and on Saturday, October 11, 2008, at the Rodeo Arena at Central Arizona College - Signal Peak Campus.**
3. NO EXCEPTIONS. Ear tagging must be done and pictures taken on the designated ear tagging and picture day only. Exhibitors must be present.
4. During ear tagging, each market and carcass beef exhibitor will complete an ear tag entry form, which will serve as an

official entry form for participating at the 2009 Pinal County Fair.

5. To exhibit in the Arizona Bred Class at the 2009 Pinal County Fair, exhibitors must turn in a copy of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of their animal at the time of ear tagging.
6. Ear tagging dates are FINAL for all entry for exhibit into the market and carcass divisions at the Pinal County Fair. No replacement of animals after the final beef ear tagging date.

C. **MARKET BEEF FAIR AND EXHIBITING REQUIREMENTS**

1. Market Beef, in order to be accepted for the fair, MUST WEIGHT A MINIMUM of 950 lbs. as determined at official weigh-in.
2. All Steers must be de-horned and manageable by the exhibitor at the time of weigh-in. The exhibitor must be able to lead their market steer to and away from the scales without assistance. Any exhibitor's beef animal deemed unmanageable by the superintendents will NOT be allowed to show or sell at the fair.
3. Market beef will be weighed in across the scale one (1) time only. No wet animals will be weighed in.
4. Market beef have a MAXIMUM SALE WEIGHT of 1250 lbs. Thus, at Auction, market beef will sell for a maximum weight of 1250 lbs.
5. FEEDER STEERS shall not exceed the maximum weight of 949 lbs. Feeder steers must be entered as such prior to the fair. Weigh-in requirements and shrink apply.
6. Exhibitors must declare no sale at time of weigh-in, if you so choose. Grand and Reserve will sell regardless. Photo, stall and fair pass fees will be collected from No Sale Animals at the time of receiving. **No Exceptions!**
7. Exhibitors must submit a completed and up-to-date financial record of their beef project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. All financial records, AZ Department of Ag Seasonal Passes and code of conduct forms must be turned in at time of receiving/weigh-in. **NO FINANCIAL RECORDS, NO SEASONAL PASS AND NO CODE OF CONDUCT FORM - NO SHOW!**
8. Beef entries must be secured by both a neck rope and a rope halter.

IN ADDITION TO THESE BEEF REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE READ THE SECTION OF GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

MARKET GOAT REQUIREMENTS

ALL 4-H, FFA AND ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MUST BE PROPERLY ENROLLED FOR THE 2008-2009 CLUB YEAR UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF ANY ENROLLED 4-H MARKET GOAT PROJECT LEADER, AG-ED INSTRUCTOR AND/OR AN ASSOCIATION LEADER. THESE RECOGNIZED CLUBS AND MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO UPHOLD THE FOLLOWING GOAT PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.

A. **MARKET GOAT PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS**

1. All market entries must be wether or doe kids of any breed.
2. Meat Goat projects must be owned by the 4-H, FFA or Association member no later than Saturday, December 13, 2008, the final date of ear tagging.

B. **EAR TAGGING REQUIREMENTS**

1. Ear tagging will be done at a central location.
2. Ear tagging for market goat projects will be done as follows:
EASTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 6, 2008 - 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Kearny
WESTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 13, 2008 - 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Pinal County Fairgrounds
3. No exceptions -Ear tagging must be done on the designated ear tagging days only and exhibitors must be present.
4. During ear tagging, each market goat exhibitor will complete an ear tag entry form, which will serve as an official entry form for participating at the 2009 Pinal County Fair.
5. To exhibit in the Arizona Bred Class at the 2009 Pinal County Fair, exhibitors must turn in a copy of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of their animal at the time of ear tagging.
6. All doe kids must have an Arizona Department of Agriculture official premise identification ear tag. The Premise ID tag will be printed with the animal breeder's official premise identification number.
7. Ear tagging dates are FINAL for all entry for exhibit into the market and carcass divisions at the Pinal County Fair.

No replacement of animals after the final goat ear tagging date.

C. FAIR AND EXHIBITING REQUIREMENTS

1. MINIMUM WEIGHT for market goats is 65 lbs., as determined at official weigh-in.
2. Market goats will be weighed in across the scale one (1) time only. No re-weighing.
3. Market Goats must be 12 months of age or younger and must have all of their milk teeth at the time of receiving at the fair. Goats older than 12 months of age and/or missing milk teeth will not be allowed to show in the market show.
4. Market Goats must be dehorned, feet trimmed and hair growth of no more than 3/8 inch upon arrival at the fair.
5. Horns on market goats may not exceed one inch in length and must be tipped blunt prior to arrival to the fair. Removal of horns is not allowed on fair grounds. Goats may not have any blood or bleeding from the tipping or dehorning process. Make sure that this is done well in advance of the show.
6. Market goats sifted for weight, age, or milk teeth will be allowed to show in the showmanship class only. These market goats must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday evening at 5:00 p.m.
7. In showing market goats, BRACING will be at the discretion of the judge.
8. Exhibitors must submit a complete and up-to-date financial record of their meat goat project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. All Code of Conduct Forms, Financial Forms and AZ Department of Ag Seasonal Passes must be turned in at time of receiving/weigh-in. **NO CODE OF CONDUCT FORM, NO FINANCIAL AND/OR NO SEASONAL PASS - NO SHOW!**
9. Exhibitors must declare no sale at time of weigh-in, if you so choose. Grand and Reserve will sell regardless. Photo, stall and fair pass fees will be collected from No Sale Animals at the time of receiving. **No Exceptions!**

IN ADDITION TO THESE MEAT GOAT REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE READ THE SECTION OF GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

MARKET LAMB REQUIREMENTS

ALL 4-H, FFA AND ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MUST BE PROPERLY ENROLLED FOR THE 2008-2009 CLUB YEAR UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF AN ENROLLED 4-H MARKET LAMB PROJECT LEADER, AG-ED INSTRUCTOR AND/OR AN ASSOCIATION LEADER. THESE RECOGNIZED CLUBS AND MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO UPHOLD THE FOLLOWING LAMB PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.

A. MARKET LAMB PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. All animals must be market type wether or ewe lambs. No pure wool breed lambs allowed in as market animals.
2. Any ewe lamb pregnant at the tagging date and weigh in at the time of fair will be disqualified from the market class, but may be shown in the showmanship class. The animal must be removed from the fairgrounds before Friday night.
3. If a pregnancy test is needed, it will be at the expense of the exhibitor.
4. Market lamb projects must be owned by the 4-H, FFA or Association member no later than Saturday, December 13, 2008, the final date for ear tagging.

B. MARKET LAMB EAR TAGGING REQUIREMENTS

1. Ear tagging will be done at a central location.
2. All ear tagging will be done as follows:
EASTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 6, 2008 - 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Kearny
WESTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 13, 2008 - 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Pinal County Fairgrounds
3. No exceptions -Ear tagging and tattooing must be done on the designated ear tagging days only and exhibitors must be present.
4. There will be no replacement of ear tagged lambs allowed after the final ear tagging date.
5. All ewe lambs must have an Arizona Department of Agriculture official premise identification ear tag. The Premise ID tag will be printed with the animal breeder's official premise identification number.
6. To exhibit in the Arizona Bred Class at the 2009 Pinal County Fair, exhibitors must turn in a copy of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of their animal at the time of ear tagging.
7. Ear tagging dates are FINAL for all entry for exhibit into the market and carcass divisions at the Pinal County Fair. No replacement of animals after the final lamb ear tagging date.

C. **MARKET LAMB FAIR AND EXHIBITING REQUIREMENTS**

1. All lambs must be sheared having no more than ½" wool, with butt wool allowed at receiving. All lambs must be in accepted condition, quality finish and in good health. If lambs are in poor condition and health, the lamb will be sifted at the scales. Feet must be trimmed at weigh-in.
2. All market lambs must have their lamb's teeth in place at time of weigh-in. Any lambs without their lambs teeth will not be allowed to show.
3. Market lambs must weigh at least a minimum of 100 pounds and cannot exceed 165 pounds at weigh-in for entry into the fair. Any animal not making weight will be disqualified from the market class and will not be sold at the auction. The animal maybe shown in showmanship class, but must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday night.
4. Market lambs will be weighed in across the scale one (1) time only. No re-weighing.
5. Exhibitors must submit a completed and up-to-date financial record of their lamb project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. All financial records, AZ Department of Ag Seasonal Passes and code of conduct forms must be turned in at time of receiving/weigh-in. **NO FINANCIAL RECORDS, NO SEASONAL PASS AND NO CODE OF CONDUCT FORMS - NO SHOW!**
6. Bedding will be allowed as long as the exhibitor uses a retainer to keep bedding in his or her own pen.
7. Exhibitors must declare No Sale a time of weigh-in, if you so choose. Grand and Reserve will sell regardless. Photo, stall and fair pass fees will be collected from No Sale Animals at the time of receiving. **No Exceptions!**

IN ADDITION TO THESE MARKET LAMB REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE READ THE SECTION OF GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

Sheep Team Grooming Contest

Entry Deadline: Postmarked by March 2, 2009

Official Entry Forms are available online and in the Pre-fair Exhibitor mailing.

The Sheep Team Grooming Contest is a team event. The teams will be judged on speed, team work, grooming skills and showmanship knowledge.

1. The team will consist of three exhibitors. At least one member must be an exhibitor in the Lamb Division, and the other two team members maybe from other livestock divisions.
2. The team may use grooming aids that they feel will improve the look of the animal that are within the guidelines of the *Code of Conduct* and the *Pinal County Junior Livestock Program Market & Carcass Requirements Book*.
3. This is a timed event that consists of three separate stages. Each team member will be solely responsible for one stage of the contest.

Stage 1 - Washing	30 minutes
Stage 2 - Shearing & Grooming	60 minutes
Stage 3 - Showmanship	Judge's discretion

4. Each team will provide their own equipment. Once the timed event has begun, the team members will not be allowed to leave the show area.
5. The team member that is being judged may have verbal assistance, from their own team members. There will be NO outside help from leaders, family members or spectators.
6. When the time is called on the shearing and grooming portion of the event, the exhibitors and animals will immediately proceed to the show ring for the showmanship judging.

Additional Team Grooming Contest Guidelines:

- Lambs used for this event will be provided by an outside source.
- A draw system will determine which lamb each team will be using during the contest.
- The team member that will be the showman in stage 3 of the contest must be in proper show attire. (See page 4, Item J, for proper show attire rules.)
- The team may proceed to the next stage of the contest if they are finished before the allotted time.
- The animals may NOT be handled by any team member prior to the contest.
- There will be NO help from leaders or other club members. This includes going after supplies or verbal comments.
- Only fines or surgical blades will be used to shear the sheep.
- Surgical tape will be placed on all ewe teats to prevent injury.

Disqualification from competition:

Teams will be disqualified from the Sheep Team Grooming Contest if any of the rules or guidelines are not followed. In addition, teams may also be disqualified for any of the following items:

- Outside help of any kind.
- Major cuts or lacerations in shearing.
- Fighting among team members.
- Any member of the team leaving the show area during the contest.
- Taunting or negative comments made by teams towards another team.

The superintendents and a Sheep leader of the team in question, along another sheep leader will determine any disqualifications.

MARKET SWINE REQUIREMENTS

ALL 4-H, FFA AND ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MUST BE PROPERLY ENROLLED FOR THE 2008-2009 CLUB YEAR UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF AN ENROLLED 4-H MARKET SWINE PROJECT LEADER, AG-ED INSTRUCTOR AND/OR AN ASSOCIATION LEADER. THESE RECOGNIZED CLUBS AND MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO UPHOLD THE FOLLOWING SWINE PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.

A. MARKET SWINE PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. All market entries must be market barrows or gilts.
2. Market swine projects must be owned by the 4-H, FFA or Association member no later than Saturday, December 13, 2008, the final date of ear tagging.

B. MARKET SWINE EAR TAGGING REQUIREMENTS

1. Ear tagging will be done at a central location.
2. Ear tagging for market swine projects will be done as follows:
 - EASTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 6, 2008** - 9:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Kearny
 - WESTERN PINAL COUNTY - December 13, 2008** - 8:00 a.m. - 11:00 a.m. - Pinal County Fairgrounds
3. All exhibitors must be present at the designated ear tagging days. No exceptions.
4. To exhibit in the Arizona Bred Class at the 2009 Pinal County Fair, exhibitors must turn in a **COPY** of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of their animal at the time of ear tagging.
5. Ear tagging dates are FINAL for all entry for exhibit into the market and carcass divisions at the Pinal County Fair. No replacement of animals after the final swine ear tagging date.

C. CLASSIFICATION OF SWINE FOR SHOW

1. All market swine will be classified by breed and then by weight for judging at the Pinal County Fair. The following will be the breed classes used for classifying: Duroc, Hampshire, Yorkshire, All Other Breeds Light, All Other Breeds Dark, Dark Crossbred and Light Crossbred.
2. Classification Guidelines for the Breed Classes:
 - a) **Duroc** – Must be red, with down ears and show no white spots or marks. A maximum of three (3) black spots none larger than a quarter, and must not show black hair.
 - b) **Hampshire** – Must be black with white belt encircling the front legs and shoulders. Must have erect ears, white must not continue behind the rear navel, above the rear hock, or over the edge/rim of snout.
 - c) **Yorkshire** – Must be white with erect ears. Any “freckles” present must be no larger than a silver dollar when combined or bigger than a quarter alone.
 - d) **All Other Breeds (AOB) Light** – Chester White and Landrace Breeds. Must be all white with down ears. Must possess the accepted breed association characteristics.
 - e) **All Other Breeds (AOB) Dark** – Berkshire, Poland China and Spotted Breeds. Must possess the accepted breed association characteristics.
 - f) **Dark Crossbred** – Any nontraditional marked Hampshire, Red colored or any Dark swine determined to be outside of the breed guidelines at fair time.
 - g) **Light Crossbred** – Any blue or over marked Yorkshire or any Light colored swine determined to be outside of the breed guidelines at fair time.
3. Each swine exhibitor will declare their animals breed on the official entry form at ear tagging.
4. These breed classifications are the guidelines that will be used for the 2009 Pinal County Fair. All pigs at the time of receiving at fair will be subject to re-classification. The decision of the classifier(s) is FINAL.
5. There must be a minimum of 5 animals entered for champions to be selected in a breed class. Breeds with less than the

minimum will be transferred to another breed class at the discretion of the Swine Superintendents.

D. MARKET SWINE FAIR AND EXHIBITING REQUIREMENTS

1. Market Swine
 - a) Swine should be restricted from contact with other livestock and dogs at the fair.
 - b) All out-of-state entries must meet Arizona import regulations including permit, testing and quarantine regulations as prescribed by law.
 - c) Show swine must NOT be from premise where garbage has been fed.
2. No unloading of swine until the scales open. Swine will be weighed during official weigh in hours only.
3. Market swine, in order to be accepted for the fair, **MUST WEIGH A MINIMUM OF 210 lbs.**, determined at official weigh in and cannot exceed 285 lbs. Any animal not making weight will be disqualified from the market class and will not be sold at auction. The animal may be shown in showmanship class, but must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday night.
4. Market swine must be clean and free of excess mud and debris before entering the scales. All swine will be weighed in across the scale one time only. No re-weighing.
5. Market swine have a **MAXIMUM SALE WEIGHT OF 275 LBS.** Thus, at auction, market swine will only pay up to the maximum sale weight of 275 lbs.
6. Exhibitors members must submit a complete and up-to-date financial record of their swine project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. All of these financial records, inspection certificates and code of conduct forms must be turned in during receiving/weigh-in. **NO FINANCIAL RECORDS, NO INSPECTION CERTIFICATE AND NO CODE OF CONDUCT FORM - NO SHOW!**
7. Only exhibitors with an ear tagged market swine will be allowed to show in swine showmanship. **NO BREEDING OR FEEDER** animals will be allowed to be shown in showmanship.
8. Sand and other approved bedding will be allowed.
9. Exhibitors must declare no sale at time of weigh-in, if you so choose. Photo, stall and fair pass fees will be collected from No Sale Animals at the time of receiving. **No Exceptions!**
10. Hogs weighing more than 285 lbs. at weigh-in will not be allowed to sell.

IN ADDITION TO THESE MARKET SWINE REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE READ THE SECTION OF GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

MARKET VEAL REQUIREMENTS

ALL 4-H, FFA AND ASSOCIATION MEMBERS MUST BE PROPERLY ENROLLED FOR THE 2008-2009 CLUB YEAR UNDER THE GUIDANCE OF AN ENROLLED 4-H MARKET VEAL PROJECT LEADER, AG-ED INSTRUCTOR AND/OR AN ASSOCIATION LEADER. THESE RECOGNIZED CLUBS AND MEMBERS MUST AGREE TO UPHOLD THE FOLLOWING VEAL PROJECT REQUIREMENTS.

A. MARKET VEAL PROJECT OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. Veal calves must be Holstein type and show their respective breed characteristics. (Holstein breed character is defined as follows: angularity of body and legs, withers-sharp, neck-long and lean, clean cut throat, dewlap and brisket, ribs-wide, flat and long, thighs-incurving to flat when viewed from the side.)
2. Veal projects must be owned by the 4-H, FFA or Association members no later than Saturday, January 17, 2009 which is also the date for ear tagging.
3. Veal calves are required to be a minimum of **100 days old** at the time of receiving during fair. This means veal calves must be born no later than December 14, 2008.

B. MARKET VEAL EAR TAGGING AND PICTURE REQUIREMENTS

1. Ear tagging and photographs showing the ear tag, animal and exhibitor will be done at a central location.
2. Ear tagging and photographs will be done **Saturday, January 10, 2009, and Saturday, January 17, 2009, at the Pinal County Fairgrounds from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m.**
3. **NO EXCEPTIONS.** Ear tagging must be done and pictures taken on the designated ear tagging and picture day only. Exhibitors must be present.

4. During ear tagging, each market veal exhibitor will complete an information form which will serve as an official entry form for participating at the 2008 Pinal County Fair.
5. To exhibit in the Arizona Bred Class at the 2008 Pinal County Fair, exhibitors must turn in a copy of the Bill of Sale for the purchase of their animal at the time of ear tagging.
6. Veal calves **MUST** be de-horned and castrated before ear tagging.
7. Ear tagging dates are **FINAL** for all entry for exhibit into the market and carcass divisions at the Pinal County Fair. No replacement of animals after the final veal ear tagging date.

C. MARKET VEAL FAIR AND EXHIBITING REQUIREMENTS

1. Veal calves must weigh at least a minimum of 250 pounds and cannot exceed 325 pounds at weigh-in for entry into the fair. Any animal not making weight will be disqualified from the market class and will not be sold at auction. The animal may be shown in showmanship class, but must be removed from the fairgrounds by Friday night.
2. Veal calves shall be fed primarily with milk or a milk replacer for the feeding ration. Calves must be bottle or bucket fed during the fair. No nursing animals will be allowed on the fair grounds.
3. Veal calves must be manageable by the exhibitor at the time of weigh-in.
4. A 5% shrink will only be applied to animals weighing below the minimum 250 lbs. weight requirement.
5. Market veal will be weighed in across the scale one (1) time only. No wet animals will be weighed in.
6. Showmanship techniques will be the same as for market beef classes.
7. Grooming of veal calves will be similar to market beef. No slick shearing of animals will be allowed.
8. Exhibitors must submit a complete and up-to-date financial record of their veal project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. All Code of Conduct Forms, Financial Forms and AZ Department of Ag Seasonal Pass must be turned in at time of receiving/weigh-in. **NO CODE OF CONDUCT FORM, NO FINANCIAL AND/OR NO SEASONAL PASS - NO SHOW!**
9. Exhibitors must declare no sale at time of weigh-in, if you so choose. Grand and Reserve will sell regardless. Photo, stall and fair pass fees will be collected from No Sale Animals at the time of receiving. **No Exceptions!**

IN ADDITION TO THESE VEAL REQUIREMENTS, PLEASE READ THE SECTION OF GENERAL REQUIREMENTS OF ALL LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS.

CARCASS CONTEST RULES

Introduction & Objectives: The primary objective of the carcass contest is to promote production of beef, goats, lambs, swine and veal which will yield superior carcasses. This contest should provide an educational program which promotes approved practices in selecting, feeding and finishing a market animal on the basis of carcass merit. All carcasses will be judged and placed on current market standards.

General Rules

1. Carcass Exhibitors are **REQUIRED** to attend the Evaluation and Awards Program for the Carcass Division.
2. The general rules contained in the **MARKET ANIMAL REQUIREMENTS** apply to this contest.
3. Animals entered in the carcass contest cannot be entered in the market division.
4. Carcass animals will be received approximately one week before the start of fair.
5. All carcass animals will be judged on the Danish (purple, blue, red, or white) system. Only those animals which yield carcasses of necessary quality to be awarded Grand or Reserve Champion awards will be so designated. Depending upon carcass quality, a division may not have a Grand or Reserve Champion carcass.
6. Only the Grand and Reserve Champion carcasses will be sold at the auction on a live weight basis. All other exhibitors will be responsible for arranging a private treaty sale. All meat processing charges, for non-champion exhibits, shall be the financial responsibility of the 4-H/FFA/Association carcass exhibitor.
7. All entrants accept the designated processing location selected by the Junior Livestock committee.
8. Carcass animals cannot be floored at the auction.
9. Exhibitors must submit a complete and up-to-date financial record of their carcass project. All paperwork must be completed by the exhibitor. An inspection certificate, either a Seasonal Pass or a swine certificate of Inspection, must be turned in with your carcass project and separate from your market project. All of these financial records, inspection

certificates and code of conduct forms must be turned in during receiving/weigh-in. **No Financial Records, No Inspection Certificates and No Code of Conduct - NO SHOW!**

Pinal County Junior Livestock Program

Code of Conduct

The Junior Livestock Committee makes every effort to establish a fair and non-threatening environment for all participants. It is the Committee's goal that all participants in the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program enjoy a positive experience, and gain responsibility, leadership and business skills that will assist them in a life of success.

1. All exhibitors, leaders, parents and resource volunteers participating in the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program are expected at all times to conduct themselves in a manner that is respectful towards others and towards animals.
2. All participants will exhibit positive behavior including honesty, and courtesy, by interacting with others in an appropriate and positive fashion. This behavior includes the demonstration of good sportsmanship by being modest in winning and being generous in defeat.
3. All participants will obey all federal, state and local laws including equal opportunity and anti-discrimination statutes.
4. At no time will any exhibitor use any illegal drugs, alcohol or tobacco products while participating in the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program.
5. Exhibitors will wear official 4-H, FFA or Association dress while showing and selling their livestock projects. Exhibitors not following the dress code will not be allowed into the show or sale ring.
6. Exhibitors will care for and groom their animals while at the Pinal County Fair. All animals will be fed and watered each and every day that the animal is on the fairgrounds without exception!
7. Animals are the responsibility of the exhibitor, therefore the exhibitor assumes full responsibility for any damage, injury, or loss incurred to, or caused by their animal while at the Pinal County Fair.
8. The Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee reserves the right to deny participation to anyone who does not adhere to the rules and regulations of the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program. The Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee also maintains, at its discretion, the right to remove any participant from the Pinal County Fair that is determined to be in blatant violation of any of the rules or regulations of the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program.
8. Only immediate family members, current Pinal County Jr. Livestock Exhibitors, or approved PCJLC Leaders are allowed to ASSIST the exhibitor in fitting, showing, and overall care of their project animal(s). The exhibitor must be present and physically engaged at ALL times while assistance is being offered. (Physical presence is NOT considered active participation or physically engaged.)
 - A. Leaders, assistant leaders, or anyone else interested in helping the youth livestock exhibitors must become certified as an approved PCJLC Leader. An approved PCJLC Leader is defined as any adult, 18 years of age or older, who has completed a Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee Leader Registration Form. This form must be completed and submitted to the Junior Livestock Committee no later than the time of specie ear tagging. All adult leaders, even if they are certified 4-H, Association, or FFA Leaders, must register with the PCJLC in order to become approved.
 - B. Upon first violation of this rule, the exhibitor will have a \$100 fine deducted from their auction sales check or, if the animal has been declared a no sale, a \$100 fine will be required by immediate payment. Second violation, the exhibitor will be removed from the auction.

10. All exhibitors must comply with the USDA Wholesome Meat Act, and the Wholesome Assurance Statement as published below. Health Regulations of the United States Department of Agriculture require that animals treated with drugs, pesticides or any other chemical must go through the prescribed withdrawal period as listed on the label. Therefore, it is important that exhibitors determine the type of treatments used if the animals must be dipped or treated prior to leaving the point of origin.

USDA WHOLESOME MEAT ACT

The United States Department of Agriculture Wholesome Meat Act applies to the sale of market livestock sold during the Pinal County Fair as follows:

- a. Animals must be in good health and carcasses free of drug or chemical residues.
- b. Antibiotics and sulfonamides have required withdrawal periods.
- c. Before administering antibiotics and/or sulfonamides, consult a licensed practicing veterinarian, or label directions of the drug.
- d. Drug label directions for use and withdrawal periods must be followed.
- e. If drug or other chemical residues are found in tissue of carcasses, the entire carcass may be condemned. If drug or other chemical residues are found in the urine, blood or tissue from an animal sold through a sale connected with the Pinal County Fair, the PCJLC or the Fair will in no way be liable or responsible for the condition of the carcass or sale price of animal. Exhibitor will forfeit all rights to the sale proceeds.

WHOLESOME ASSURANCE STATEMENT

The use of animal drugs or other substances by non-veterinarians in any manner other than in accordance with the labeling approved by FDA, is a violation of federal law.* Food animals must not exceed FDA/EPA/USDA established tolerances for any foreign substance including drugs, pesticides, feed additives, or other chemicals. Violation results of residue testing are subject to investigation by USDA and FDA for prosecution.

Any misrepresentation of a food animal that can potentially affect the acceptability of the carcass or milk will be considered fraud.

* Note: Abuse of the extra-label privilege by veterinarians is unethical and is subject to serious consequences such as license revocation. (PLEASE CONSULT YOUR PROJECT LEADER IF YOU DO NOT UNDERSTAND ANY OF THESE STATEMENTS.)

I, the undersigned, have read and understand this code of conduct as put forth by the Pinal County Junior Livestock Committee, and will, to the best of my ability follow these rules and regulations. I understand that if I choose to disregard any of these rules or regulations I may be disqualified from showing or selling my animals, and I may further forfeit any privilege of future participation in the Pinal County Junior Livestock Program.
