William Lampman – Class of 2022 Bachelor of Science, Plant Sciences



William Lampman was awarded the Outstanding Senior in the Plant Sciences degree and was recognized by the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences Spring 2022. William was selected by the faculty in the School of Plant Sciences as an excellent student and outstanding citizen of the university and the community. William earned Bachelor of Science degrees in both Plant Sciences and in the School of Natural Resources (Conservation Management). He also earned a minor in Ecology and Evolutionary Biology and a Certificate in Zoo and Aquarium Conservation. In four year, William did all that while earning a near perfect GPA. William also worked part time for the Campus Arboretum for 2 ½ years, winning the Outstanding Senior in Horticulture award at the UArizona from the American Society of Horticulture Science Society. Arboretum work was presented as both a poster and an oral presentation at the 2021 ASHS Conference where William won 3rd place (out of about 50 competitors) William wrote dozens of species reports to populate content on the Campus Arboretum website, assisted with the creation and curation of a

collection of novelty, desert plants in the "Mark Dimmitt Desert Plant Conservatory", and created a virtual tour of that conservatory (found here: Additionally, William created botanical signs, facilitated activities for the Plant Sciences Club and for Arbor day 2020, effortlessly learned multiple technologies needed for various projects, trained other students and mapped and planted trees!

William was accepted into several Masters and PhD programs in Spring 2022 and has selected to pursue a Master's Degree in Ecology, Evolution, and Organismal Biology at the University of California, Riverside, with the goal of becoming a research professor focused on preservation of endemic species.
