II. Objectives of the Trip

Dr. Tamimi traveled to Amman, Jordan to work with the Badia Research and Development Center (BRDC) on the different activities the Sustainable Development of Dry Lands Project is performing in Jordan. In addition, Dr. Tamimi and Dr. Saad Al-Ayyash from BRDC traveled to Cairo, Egypt to coordinate and organize the workshop entitled "Anaerobic Sewage Treatment in the Middle East with a focus on Jordan and Egypt: A low-cost, lowenergy alternative" to be held in Cairo Sheraton Hotel - Cairo, Egypt between March 13-15th, 2006.

In this report the details of the trip and the meetings held in Jordan and Egypt will be presented.

III. Hotel and Hotel Reservations

Dr. Tamimi and Dr. Al-Ayyash flew from Amman, Jordan to Cairo, Egypt late in the evening on Sunday February 5, 2006. They were met with the National Research Center (NRC) public relations officer and were driven from the airport to the Cairo Sheraton Hotel late and had to wait from 10:30pm until 12:00 midnight to get a room. They were presented with an alternative of staying together in one room because the hotel was over booked by 30% of its occupancy rate. Both turned the offer down and waited until midnight to get the rooms.

The hotel is a 5-star hotel with reasonable accommodations. It has good food, good and clean rooms, good fitness center that opens from 6:00 a.m. until 11:00 p.m. with an outdoor swimming pool. Breakfast can be ordered in the room or can be eaten at the "Tea Garden". The breakfast has many varieties including fruits, cheeses, yogurts, cereals, bread, made to order eggs including omelets. The food is clean and the service is good. Reservations have breakfast included with the room. All charges include a 22% service and tax charge and hence tip is not expected but is appreciated. The Tea Garden is open around the clock for reasonably priced sandwiches, drinks, salads and ice cream.

The hotel is fairly quiet except when they have weddings that start around 9:00 p.m. and stay a little after midnight. The hotel is located on the Nile which can be viewed from the hotel.

If high clipper officials from Jordan will be attending the workshop in March, the project (BRDC) needs to make sure that they get an upgraded room, perhaps a suite. BRDC is making reservations for the rooms through a travel agent in Jordan to save about \$40.00 per night per room. The hotel has many multi purpose halls and one will be used as the venue for the workshop. The venue is being contracted through NRC to make sure it is guaranteed and to make sure the workshop will get the best service.
